Description			
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
<p>The opening workshop for the YET - Youth Embracing Togetherness project was held from May 25 to 27, 2025, in the picturesque towns of Kastoria and Siatista, Greece, hosted by YOUTHABILITY in close cooperation with the Municipality of Voio. The workshop brought together an impressive 217 participants from five European countries Greece, Spain, Slovenia, Croatia, and Romania, including young citizens,</p>			

educators, youth workers, municipal representatives, civil society actors, and EU project professionals. The large turnout highlighted the project's wide appeal and the growing commitment among European youth to engage with democratic values, sustainability, and shared European identity.

The event began on the afternoon of May 25 with a registration session in Kastoria, where participants were welcomed by local organizers. The atmosphere was vibrant, energized by the diversity of voices and experiences present. The opening remarks were delivered by Ms. Maria Ntelia, President of YOUTHABILITY, who emphasized the importance of youth-led dialogue in shaping Europe's democratic future. Her speech called attention to the need for active participation and intercultural understanding in today's complex political landscape.

Following the welcome, a detailed presentation of the project's agenda and objectives outlined the vision for YET: to build bridges between young people across Europe, empower them to act as agents of change, and strengthen cooperation between municipalities on issues central to youth. Each partner municipality Voio (Greece), Altea (Spain), Podietrek (Slovenia), Breznički Hum (Croatia), and Victoria (Romania) was then introduced. Representatives showcased their local youth engagement strategies and shared expectations for the collaboration.

A powerful sequence of thematic speeches followed. Ms. Dimitra Fantidou, an experienced EU Project Manager, opened with *"The Role of Voices of Unity in Promoting Youth's Action and Cultural Diversity"*. He explored how transnational youth networks can become engines for social cohesion. After a short break, Ms. Eleni Kasapi, Political Scientist, delivered the insightful session *"How Can a Sustainable and Green EU Be Closer to Young Citizens?"* by connecting EU climate goals with local youth action and educational innovation.

This was followed by Ms. Georgia Tsironi, a distinguished Journalist, who addressed *"The Role of Youth as the Architects of a United Europe"*. She highlighted the necessity of transforming youth from passive observers into active policy-shapers and emphasized the importance of media literacy and representation. The day concluded with a highly interactive round table discussion titled *"EU Myths & Realities: Busting Euroscepticism through Youth-Led Storytelling,"* moderated by Ms. Katerina Solomonidou and Ms. Stefania Zygomani. Young participants courageously addressed disinformation and misconceptions about the EU, sharing personal stories that underscored the importance of truth, solidarity, and mutual respect in building European unity. The evening closed with a welcome dinner, fostering intercultural exchange and bonding in a festive and inclusive atmosphere.

On May 26, participants traveled to Siatista, where activities resumed with an open debate: *"Does EU Enlargement Benefit Youth?"*. Voices from all five countries shared concerns, hopes, and ideas for building a more inclusive Europe. A thematic session on *"Youth Perspectives on Identity and Belonging in the EU"* followed, prompting reflection on cultural heritage, civic identity, and European values.

In the afternoon, the spotlight turned to innovation and problem-solving. Two interactive Youth Power Lab workshops engaged participants in hands-on collaboration. In Lab 1, teams co-designed responses to real-life challenges facing their communities ranging from youth apathy to environmental sustainability. In Lab 2, the focus was on translating local insights into EU-level influence and policy recommendations. The Results & Reflections session afterward gave participants the chance to present their work, receive feedback, and inspire one another with bold, future-oriented ideas.

The evening ended with a social dinner, where music, storytelling, and friendship filled the room. The event had already begun to deliver on its promise of connecting young people not just as project partners but as fellow Europeans with shared ambitions.

On May 27, the final day of the event, participants visited the Municipality of Voio and regional decision-making departments in Western Macedonia. This study visit provided a rare, firsthand look at local policy processes and youth inclusion mechanisms in public governance. It was both educational and inspiring, bridging the gap between theory and practice.

The day continued with an open forum, *"Youth & Municipalities on Co-Designing Civic Life in Twin Towns,"* during which youth participants worked side-by-side with local leaders to propose tangible actions for participatory governance, co-created public spaces, and youth advisory councils. The final debate, *"Green Deal or Raw Deal? Youth on Europe's Sustainability Agenda,"* energized the audience and closed the event on a high note. Participants challenged current EU sustainability policies and proposed bold new ideas for involving youth in achieving climate justice. Many expressed strong interest in following up with campaigns, petitions, and awareness-raising actions upon returning to their communities.

The workshop concluded with a closing lunch and ceremony, filled with emotion, laughter, and a renewed sense of purpose. As participants said their goodbyes, they carried with them not just new friendships, but also the tools, confidence, and determination to be active European citizens and community leaders. The YET Kick-Off Workshop was more than an event it was a launchpad for transformative action, intercultural dialogue, and democratic participation. With 172 participants actively

engaged over three days, the workshop laid the foundation for a vibrant, youth-driven European network that will grow stronger with each future YET event.

These outcomes highlight the transformative potential of youth-led initiatives and reinforce YET's mission to bridge local action with European values in meaningful and lasting ways.
